Truth and Love Both

Some Christians, professing Christ, seem to think that a main way to evangelize (share the good news of the Gospel) is just to <u>love</u> unbelievers into the faith. We certainly should love sinners, but what does that mean? <u>Truth</u> is important. Real love for sinners should motivate us to confront error and offer hope. The Spirit says, "As a result, we are no longer to be children, tossed here and there by waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by the trickery of

men, by craftiness in deceitful scheming; but <u>speaking the truth in love</u>, we are to grow up in all aspects into Him who is the head, even Christ" (Eph 4:14-15).

Notice, He speaks of the "trickery of men" and "craftiness in deceitful scheming." Over and over again, the Bible stresses to be on guard against false prophets and teachers. Should Christians confront "trickery", "craftiness", and "deceitful scheming" or just wrap a loving arm around sinners?


Paul's Mars Hill, for me of late, has been <u>Social Media</u>. One "deceitful" scheme is evolution—the notion that nature does not need a Creator—it can all happen on its own over millions (and billions) of years. Instead of saying "God has done marvelous things," many social-media people say, "Evolution has done marvelous things." Evolution thus becomes a substitute for God—an idol of the mind. Science, not God's Word, is their authority (their bible). James Dickson wrote to me on Sept 10, 2016, "You only have 2 choices. Either genesis is taken allegorically or Christianity has been disproven by utilizing modern science."

Others might put it this way, that honey gathers more flies than vinegar. I am hard pressed to find that kind of teaching in the Bible. John the Baptist was not giving out honey but got a lot of attention, nevertheless, by speaking truth. Jesus performed the greatest act of love imaginable but was scorned, mocked, and crucified in the process.

I try to stress <u>truth</u> in social media but have been called a liar many times. Does this mean I am doing something wrong? Should I stop? The thinking of some might go like this, "Paul, what you write upsets people—be nice—give them honey." Well, it's hard telling people to repent with honey; they need truth. What truth?—that they have offended God and that He has provided an escape for them—from their self-centered pride and hell. They need to repent (Lk 13:3) and bowing before the One who conquered death.

Have I met with success? I think so, but that does not mean speaking the truth-in-love meets no opposition. It meets a lot. When the Apostle spoke at Athens, he got mixed responses. Jesus said that He Himself came to bring division ("Do you suppose that I came to grant peace on

earth? I tell you, no, but rather division," Lk 12:51). Do I get any positive responses? Yes, let me supply some examples.

Yes, those who accepted Jesus as the way the truth and the life shall never die but will live for all eternity." This was in response to one of my videos.



Here's a negative, from James Johnson on 9/1/16: "Your fruit is rotten, Paul Humber. You lie about dinosaurs and the age of the earth all the time." Does Jesus prepare us for this? He said, "Blessed are you when people insult you and persecute you, and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of Me. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward in heaven is great; for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you."



Maggie Barr wrote, "But I just had it yesterday with those kooks trying to heckle and bully Paul G. Humber." Here is what a New York "Senior [Prison] Chaplain" wrote about the debate, "Greetings and good morning Mr. Humber, I have recently viewed your New York debate with Rabbi Stinger and I wanted to express my gratitude to you for being an example of what it is to be walking with truth and clearly with the fruits of the Holy Spirit. My prayer for all Christians that view this debate is that they are able to identify the physical aspects of the fruit of the Holy Spirit for if they are not, a debate like this can be quite confusing to many. Please know that you and your ministry will be in my prayers and again thank you for giving us a prime example of the spirit. May our Lord continue to guide you and be with you."
